
I don't know, it would seem to a logical mind that would be the thing to do. As an advisory board it would, likewise, appear that there would be an opportunity for


dialogue on the issue. It is also obvious that the ball is in your court and the eyes of taxpaying Americans are on you to make the proper recommendations.
